THE SACRAMENTO REGION SPORTS EDUCATION FOUNDATION, A 501-C-3 NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION, AND THE PACIFIC ASSOCIATION OF USA TRACK AND FIELD, JOINTLY SERVING AS THE LOCAL ORGANIZING COMMITTEE ("LOC") OF THE 2001 NATIONAL JUNIOR OLYMPIC CHAMPIONSHIPS, ARE SEEKING PROPOSALS FOR FOOD CONCESSIONS FOR THE 2001 NATIONAL JUNIOR OLYMPIC CHAMPIONSHIPS AT THE A.G. SPANOS SPORTS COMPLEX ON THE CAMPUS OF CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SACRAMENTO ("CSUS").

A GENERAL OVERVIEW

The National Junior Olympic Championships is the largest youth track and field event in the world and will be held July 24-29, 2001. The event showcases young male and female athletes between the ages of 8-18 in the sport of track and field.

Selected bidders will have exclusivity to sell one or more specified items of food. Beverage rights will be retained by LOC. Selected bidder will pay LOC a rights fee of \$5,000, payable at time of awarding of contract.

LOC will provide to bidder: 10' x 10' tent, power, water, and trash removal.

Bidder shall supply all food, equipment, and service personnel necessary to perform under this proposal. Bidder must also provide a back-up generator in the event of a “blackout” at the stadium due to the energy situation in California.

Food concessions will take place inside the stadium at locations approved by LOC and CSUS.

Fans at the event may bring in coolers with their own food and beverages. SOBE beverages will have a presence at the event and will be giving away free samples.

LOC is not responsible for theft or loss of equipment.

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SPECIFICS OF FOOD

CONCESSIONS

Concession stands will be located at the south end of the stadium in one centralized location or “food court”. LOC expects 6000 young athletes at the venue as well as another 2000 parents and spectators for the six days of competition.

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THE BID PROPOSAL

Bids should include the following information:

CONCESSIONS

- A. Proposed items with maximum prices of food items
- B. Electrical needs
- C. Number of service people required and how attired

GENERAL

- A. References
- B. Copies of Health Permit and applicable licenses
- C. Proof of liability, workers compensation and other applicable insurance and bonds
- D. Timetable and set-up plan and installation

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BASIS OF AWARD

This contract will be awarded based on the following points:

- A. Ability of the company to provide the services as described above
- B. Food items, prices and quality of food services.

A full proposal is due by 3:00 p.m. PST, April 16, 2001. This contract will be awarded no later than April 18, 2001.
